



## Female Figure [Ere Ibeji]

### Date

mid 20th century

### Primary Maker

Nigeria, Yoruba people

### Medium

wood and pigment

### Description

An Ibeji figure is carved whenever a twin dies. The figure is tenderly cared for, washed, anointed with camwood powder, rubbed with indigo, and dressed in beads, thus placating the spirit of the dead twin. A Yoruba mother gains honor from the number of twins she has borne, even though most or all may die.
